

# Stormwater Quality Program



*The City of Longmont participates in The Keep it Clean Partnership (KICP), a collaborative effort of Colorado communities in the Boulder and St. Vrain watersheds to protect water quality. The KICP focuses on developing programs that meet the requirements of federal, state and municipal stormwater regulations.*

Stormwater Quality Programs are conducted individually, and in partnership with the KICP, and include:

- Community Outreach and Public School Programs to increase public awareness of water quality issues
  - Storm Drain Stenciling Program
  - Brochures and stormwater quality reports
  - The annual Children's Water Festival attended by SVVSD 5th grade students
  - Tributary signs identify significant waterways
- Stormwater Pollution Prevention Programs for Private and Public Sectors
  - Stormwater pollution prevention evaluations of restaurants and vehicle service facilities
  - Pollution prevention training for municipal employees
  - Inspection and certification of municipal operations facilities to ensure pollution prevention and good housekeeping best management practices are in place
- Erosion Control, Illegal Discharge Prevention and Maintenance of Storm Drains and Permanent Water Quality Structures
  - Enforcement procedures to address improper or illegal connections and discharges
  - Participation in a "Spill Hotline" to respond to calls regarding illegal discharges
  - Monitoring, inspection and enforcement of best management practices during construction
  - Inspection and enforcement procedures to ensure maintenance of permanent water quality structures
