I am looking forward to our oil class. Below is a list of supplies you will need. You can find these materials at Michaels or Hobby Lobby.

TABLE EASEL or standing easel

PALATTE for paints (Either disposable or regular pallet for oil paints. Please have a large palette. You need room to mix paints. An oil palette is FLAT it does not have indents to hold liquid!

OIL PAINTS (Be sure to have ALL oil base **OR** all water base paints!)

(I use Titanium white, Cadmium Yellow Pale, Cadmium

Yellow, Cadmium Orange, Cadmium Red, Alizarin Crimson, Yellow Ocre

Light, Sap green, Cobalt Blue, Ultramarine Blue, Dioxazine Purple. These are my favorites.

CANVAS

2 18 x 24 inch artists canvas panels (for making color chart) Fredricks has 2 to a package

Roll of masking tape (1/2 in in width or less, if possible)

After completing your color chart you are ready to work on your first painting. Choose a smaller one such as 11" x 14".

BRUSHES (This is your most important tool!) Bristle brushes are mainly used for oil painting as they move the paint around on the textured surface of a canvas with ease. Soft hair brushes are good for small details and smooth effects. Oil brushes traditionally have long handles.

BRISTLE Filberts : sizes 4, 6, (The ends are oval shaped)

SABLE ROUND: size 3

LINER BRUSH: This brush has longer bristles for creating long fine lines.

PAPER TOWELS (I use Viva, they cost a bit more, but you will use less of them and they do not crumble) **A must to use while painting.**

ODERLESS ODERLESS MINERAL SPIRITS or OderlessTurupenoid for oil base paints only

Please use only odorless

NECESSARY ODDS AND ENDS

Palatte Knife for mixing paints (trowel shape is best and a metal one, if possible)

Photos to paint from

Metal Container with secure lid to hold your turpenoid or mineral spirits.

(Turpenoid or mineral spirts can "eat" through a plastic container)

Brush cleaner

Vine charcoal for sketching and a kneaded eraser

Color Wheel

Masking Tape (1/2 inch or Less)
